## **Dewi Sant to offer the position of full time minister to the Reverend Deian Evans**

The following proposal was put to members at a congregational meeting on October 19: The Search Committee proposes that the position of full time minister of Dewi Sant Welsh United Church be offered to the Reverend Deian Evans of Criccieth, North Wales, and further that the Toronto South Presbytery be requested to appoint the Reverend Evans as a full time ordained supply minister, commencement date to be mutually agreed upon. (The Reverend Roger Roberts will remain with us until Easter)

Subsequent to the proposal there was a question and answer period, and Vaughan Lewis (Church treasurer) gave us an overview of our current financial situation.

There was unanimous support of the proposal.

Although the search committee's work is now complete, it cannot be disbanded until the Reverend Evans' appointment. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Betty Cullingworth for the excellent work that she has done over the past year as chair of this committee. Her commitment and dedication to the task, her hospitality and unfailing optimism have been unparalleled. It was a privilege to work with her.

## **Committee Of Stewards**

At the last annual general meeting everyone was made aware of the decline in Member's contributions over the past two years. Many of us hoped that 2003 would see a reversal of this disturbing trend.

This year began poorly but improved gradually with each month so that at September 30th we were only 4% behind that of the first nine months of '02. Expressed in dollars, \$50,000 in '03 compared to \$52,000 in '02 from Members.

Income from Friends, Loose and Y Gadwyn also lagged as attendances on Sundays got smaller. "Other Income" i.e. Hall and Parking rent plus the Manse remained strong.

Certain maintenance items have been deferred for a year so that we remain close to budget by December 31/03. Next year, however, we face the probable replacing of the boiler-room furnace.

As in every household Dewi Sant must pay its bills as they become due—hydro, gas, water, taxes, Presbytery dues, insurance, salaries, etc. Regrettably, with insufficient Member contributions in the early months of '03 we were forced to redeem a Bond for \$25,000 when it matured in August in order to meet our commitments.

Many of us sometimes overlook the damaging effect of inflation and consequently tend to give our customary contributions without any increase from year to year. This is even true of those on PAR who are, at least, consistent with their offerings. Would you please, examine your own contributions and see if you also have overlooked inflation.

With the coming of a new Minister we all have a moral obligation to ensure that our contract with him will not fail for want of financial support. Whoever answers our call will be making a commitment that will have to be matched by us.

## **Mission And Service**

As the seasons change and the weather begins to get cold and wet – we bring out our warm clothing, turn on the furnace, or make plans to leave for Florida.

For many living in Toronto, and across Canada, things are not that easy especially in Winter, and they become more and more dependent on charity for shelter, and food.

THANK YOU to Dewi Sant members who regularly place food in the basket in the narthex, and to Catherine and John Otley who deliver these donations to the Lansing Food Bank. We are told that Dewi Sant is the 'top' donor to this Food Bank!!

In spite of our most generous gifts the need increases every year, and as the (edited) report below shows it is the most vulnerable members of our society who suffer.

Food Banks and Homeless Shelters were always considered 'band-aid' solutions, to the problems of poverty and the lack of affordable housing. There is talk that government funding for food banks is about to be drastically cut, or withdrawn, and some food banks may have to close down. NOW more than ever we need to put political pressure on all levels of government to eliminate the need for the band-aids, and make it possible for all to live in safety and with dignity.

## **NEW STUDY FINDS ALARMING RATES OF CHILD HUNGER AMONG ONTARIO FOOD BANK CLIENTS**

Toronto, Ontario - September 22, 2003

According to a new survey of Ontario food bank recipients released today, children in nearly 40% of families experience hunger at least once a month, including more than one in ten families where children go hungry a couple of times a week. Despite the assistance of food banks and the widespread practice of parents sacrificing their own food to feed their children, high rates of child hunger were found among food bank clients in each participating community. Amongst its key results, the study found large numbers of people with disabilities in food bank lines. Two out of five clients reported a disability that restricts their ability to work. More than half of the clients with disabilities were not on the Ontario Disability Support Program (ODSP). Study data suggest that nearly half of these clients would no longer require food banks if they were able to access ODSP. Study contributors urge all provincial parties to commit to raise the minimum wage and social assistance rates, to increase funding for child care and housing and to reinstate rent control to ensure that all Ontarians can pay the rent, feed themselves and if they have children, feed the kids.

## **Cranberry Sauce**

3 cups fresh cranberries: or frozen cranberries: 1 cup sugar: 1 cup water.

Method: Rinse the berries. Put through a food processor, blender or chop fine by hand. Boil in sugar and water for 5 minutes gently , until the berries pop. Remove from the heat, refrigerate. Grand Marnier or Cointreau can be used. Adjust sugar accordingly.

## **Cranberry Orange Sauce**

4 cups fresh cranberries: 2 oranges: 2 cups sugar.

Method: Rinse the berries and put through chopper, bender, or chop by hand. Put oranges, (skin and pulp) through the same process. Mix the oranges and the berries together. Add sugar and mix well. No cooking required. This will keep well in a refrigerator for several weeks, or may be frozen.

## **Hot Cranberry Dip**

2 cups cranberries: 3 tbsp. Horseradish: 1 tbsp. Worcestershire sauce: 1 tbsp. Lemon juice: 2 cloves garlic minced: ½ tsp. Cayenne pepper.

Method: Mix all ingredients in a saucepan. Bring the mixture to a boil, reduce the heat and simmer for 5 minutes to blend flavours. Microwave. Blend mixture in a microwave-safe bowl. Microwave on high for 3 minutes. Stir and continue cooking for 1 or 2 more minutes, stirring after each minute to make sure that it has been heated all the way through.

Serve this tasty dip with, meatballs, Vienna sausages, cut up wieners or pieces of fruit. Keep hot in a chaffing dish or an electric warmer.

# The New Euro-English (Wouldn't Welsh Be Easier?)

European Commission has just announced an agreement whereby English will be the official language of the European nation rather than German which was the other possibility.
