In fact, let's pray every day that whatever happens on June 28th God's will may be done.

## **REPORT FROM STEWARDS:**

Dewi Sant has finished its' first quarter (January to March, 2004) with very promising results. Based on the figures below, you will note that we ended March 2004 with an overall positive of \$2,028.37; this is quite an accomplishment especially when compared with the figures from the same time period last year where we had an overall loss of \$7,466.86. At a high level, our success can be attributed to the following:

- Higher donations (member, friends and associates, loose)
- Increased rental revenue (with a sizable payment for a commercial recently filmed at Dewi Sant)
- A generous donation from The St. David's Society
- Income from the sale of Videos and DVDs (filming of the St. David's Day Service).

Last but not least, we would like to thank Vaughan Lewis for his excellent leadership as Chair Of Stewards; Vaughan retired from this position this year after many years of service and will be greatly missed.
